Languages - Intent, Implementation & Impact



This Language statement is underpinned by the school Curriculum Intent statement and our Church of England school vision of 'Love of Learning, Love of Life and Love of One Another'

Intent

- To promote high ambition for **all** pupils; the school does not offer disadvantaged pupils or pupils with SEND a reduced curriculum or experience.
- To develop a love of language learning
- To broaden vocabulary in French and develop ability to understand new words in context with the focus on practical communication.
- To develop an appreciation of other cultures, preparing them to be global citizens

Implementation

- Planning provides opportunities for repetition to embed knowledge, increasing the chance of information recall whilst linking to the National Curriculum
- Teaching and learning should show progression within the strands of our schools Languages Skills and Knowledge Progression document.
- Opportunities to listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Lessons will explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words
- There will be opportunities to speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures
- Activities will develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they
 are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases
- Opportunities to present ideas and information orally
- Children will read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing
- Children will broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary
- Opportunities to write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly
- Opportunities to describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing
- Children will gain an understanding of basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied and how to apply these, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English

<u>Impact</u>

Monitoring through pupil voice, lesson observations and work scrutiny alongside assessments using our skills and knowledge progression documents with internal/external moderation will demonstrate that;

- Children will move to secondary school well-prepared for the next stage of language learning.
- Children have achieved age related expectations in French at the end of their cohort year
- Children will have developed an appreciation, enthusiasm and inquisivity of other languages.
- Children will be able to show an understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.
