- ❑ Christmas celebrates the incarnation (God becoming flesh).
- ❑ The Christmas story is told to Christians.
- ❑ Angel Gabriel visited Mary and told her that she was going to have a baby and she would call him Jesus.
- ❑ Jesus was born in a stable in Bethlehem.
- ❑ Shepherds and Kings visited Jesus and gave him gifts.
- ❑ Christians celebrate Christmas by going to church, sending cards and giving gifts.




Who is a Muslim and how do they live?

(double unit)



Key knowledge

- ❑ The Shahadah is very important for Muslims. It is recited (said) by Muslims to declare (show) that they are committed to Allah.
- ❑ Muslims believe that there is only one God referred to as Tawhid. Muhammad (Peace Be Upon Him/PBUH) is his messenger.
- ❑ Muslims learn a lot from the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) through stories such as the 'Tiny Ants' (care for all of Allah's creation and 'The Prophet Muhammad and the black stone' (being wise).
- ❑ Muslims have 99 names for Allah, such as 'All Compassionate, The Pure One and the Source of Peace'.
- ❑ Muhammad received the Holy Qur'an on the 'Night of Power'. Muslims treat the Qur'an with the upmost respect by wrapping it up.

Muslim	A person who follows the religion of Islam.
Allah	The Arabic term for "God."
Muhammad (Peace be upon him/PBUH)	The final prophet to whom Muslims believe God revealed the Qur'an.
Shahada	A statement of faith that all Muslims recite. The first of the 5 Pillars.
Messenger	Someone who delivers a message.
Tawhid	Arabic for "declaring one god". Muslims believe that there is only one God.
Qur'an	The Holy Book of Islam.
Prophet	A person Muslims believe was chosen by God to teach people about Allah's message.

Key knowledge


- ❑ Jews, Christians and Muslims believe that there is a Creator of the world, God.

Autumn 1 and 2 2024 Main Learning: 1.7 GOD/TORAH/PEOPLE Who is a Jewish and how do they live?

Key knowledge

- ❑ Jews believe that God is one and cares for all people. They also believe that it is important to love God.
- ❑ Jewish people have special objects in their homes to help them praise God.
- ❑ Family and home are very important to Jewish people.
- ❑ Shabbat is the most important day of the week for Jews, because it is a day on which they remember that God created the world and everything in it. God created the world in six days, but on the seventh day, Shabbat.
- ❑ Sukkot is a festival that remembers the time, many years ago, when the Jews spent time in the desert.
- ❑ Chanukah is a festival that remembers the re-dedication (giving back) of the temple in Jerusalem to God.

Jew	A person who follows Judaism.
Judaism	A religion that believes in one God and faithfulness to the laws of the Torah.
Shema	A Jewish prayer
Shabbat	The name of the day of rest in Judaism.
Mezuzah	A piece of parchment (paper) with a prayer written on it. It is attached to the doorpost of Jewish homes.
Tenakh	Jewish scriptures which are made up of many different smaller books.
Sukkot	A Jewish festival, also known as the Feast of Tabernacles.
Challah bread, challah board and challah cover	Challah bread is the Jewish Sabbath-and-holiday bread. It is laid on a challah board and covered with a challah cover.
Chanukah	Is a Jewish holiday that means dedication. It lasts for eight days.
Kosher food	Jews have certain laws about the foods they can eat. Food has to follow these laws in order to be eaten by Jews.

Why does Easter matter to Christians?



Key knowledge

- Christians celebrate Holy Week. This is divided up in to several parts.
- Jesus enters Jerusalem on Palm Sunday.
- Jesus is betrayed by a friend and arrested.
- Jesus is crucified and dies.
- Jesus is placed in a tomb.
- Three days later the tomb is found empty.
- Christians believe that Jesus rose from the dead. This is called resurrection.
- Easter is celebrated by Christians and is the most important of all their festivals.
- During Easter, Christians feel sadness and joy.

What is the 'Good News' Christians believe Jesus brings?

Key knowledge

- Tax Collectors worked for the Romans.
- Jesus teaches his followers that God will forgive them.
- Jesus teaches his followers to forgive each other.
- Jesus was a friend to ALL the people.
- Confession is a sacrament for Christians. They speak to God and say that they are sorry.
- The story of Zacchaeus tells Christians that even though people do wrong and unkind things Jesus will still forgive them.
- This story tells people that Jesus came to help ALL people.

New Testament	The second part of the Bible. It tells Christians all about the life of Jesus.
Disciples	12 friends of Jesus who helped spread the word of God.
Forgiveness	Saying sorry to God and being forgiven for what you have done.
Prayer	A way of asking God for help.
Confession	The action of being forgiven.
Tax collector	People who collected money from others. They were thought of as greedy and unkind.
Gospel	This means 'Good news.'
